This year AFRH is excited to announce that eligibility has been expanded to include Retired Veterans whether they served in the Regular Military, Reserve Forces, or the National Guard and their spouses who are enrolled in DEERS and were married to the service member when they retired! Veterans who did not retire, but meet eligibility due to a serviceconnected disability or service in a war theater may also apply for residency. Continuing Care Retirement Facility

AFRH is the only Federal Retirement Community offering affordable care to the veterans who defended our nation's liberty. Residents must be physically and mentally independent to be accepted as members of AFRH; but should a resident need more support once accepted, there are four more levels of care offered at AFRH. You may need just a bit of extra care such as help with your medications or occasional assistance; if so, we have Independent Living Plus available to offer home health care services without the need for you to move to another location. Should you need more assistance; we have assisted living, memory support, and long-term care available at each of our facilities. Residents may be assured that they will be able to age-in-place without worrying about the cost of care or that they would become a burden on anyone. All of AFRH's services are included in the monthly fee which is a percentage of your income at all Levels of Care.


VETERAN ELIGIBILTY

(A) YOU MUST MEET ALL OF THESE CRITERIA:

- You served in the Armed Forces (Regular Military, Reserve Forces, or National Guard) and over half of your time in the military was spent as an enlisted member, warrant officer, or limited-duty officer.
- You have never been convicted of a felony.
- You are free from active substance use disorders, psychological problems, cognitive impairments, or other mental health conditions.
- You are currently physically and mentally able to live independently. Specifically you must be able to tend to daily personal needs, attend meals in the dining hall, keep medical appointments, and make reasonable decisions regarding your own healthcare, finances, and safety without assistance from others
- (B) PLUS, YOU MUST QUALIFY UNDER AT LEAST ONE THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:
- You retired after serving over 20 years on activeduty in a regular component of the Armed Forces.
- You have been notified that you are eligible to receive retired pay and benefits from the Department of Defense because you have completed sufficient service in a non-regular component (Nat'l Guard/ Reserves) or qualify for an early retirement.
- You are suffering from a service-connected disability incurred in the line of duty in the Armed Forces
- You served in a war theater or received hostile fire pay and are suffering from disease, injury, or other disability under rules prescribed by AFRH
- You served in a women's component of the Armed Services before June 12, 1948

Back in 1811, our young nation made a "Promise" to care for its older and disabled veterans. This would be repayment for their sacrifices in defending liberty. At last, two homes were built: the US Naval Asylum in Philadelphia (1834) and the US Military Asylum in DC (1851). General Winfield Scott, a hero in the Mexican-American War, was paid reparations in lieu of ransacking Mexico City. So, Scott gave funds to Congress to open a home in DC for old and infirm soldiers. In 1976 the Naval Home relocated to Gulfport, MS. In 1991 both Homes joined forces and became the Armed Forces Retirement Home
