## Safety Tip Driving Safety—Foggy Conditions

Safety Office reminds you that when you are behind the wheel few conditions are more treacherous than driving during foggy conditions.

## 4 Tips for Driving in Fog

1 Keep safe distance. Dense fog limits visibility, leaving only seconds to react to hazards.

When driving in dense fog, you have little
time to see hazards or other vehicles in the road.
At freeway speeds, you only have a few seconds
to react to objects that become visible in the road.

Reaction

1/4 mile visibility - 15.0 seconds
1/8 mile visibility - 7.5 seconds
100 yard visibility - 7.5 seconds
100 yard visibility - 1.1 seconds

Always use low-beams.

Never use your high-beam lights as they causes glare, making it more difficult for you to see. Keep headlights on even after sunrise so others can see you!

Allow extra time for travel.

Traffic may likely be slower moving during foggy conditions. Also, avoid passing other vehicles.

Use caution when crossing bridges. Visibility is usually the lowest across bridges & goodies of water. Be aware of rapidly changing conditions.
