SUBJECT: Appointment of New AFRH Inspector General

Robert (Bob) DuFour was recently selected and now serves as the AFRH's full-time Inspector General (IG) effective November 17, 2014. Bob, a retired U.S. Air Force Lieutenant Colonel (retired in 2011), possesses a wealth of experience obtained from previous military and civilian positions.

His most recent positions include:

- (2011) Deputy Chief of Document Production overseeing production of and anti-counterfeiting of U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Service (USCIS) documents.
- (2013) Audit Liaison Officer for USCIS where he oversaw USCIS audits performed by Office of the IG, General Accounting Office.
- (2014) Audit Liaison and Hot Line Team Leader for the Federal Highway Administration

Highlights of his military assignments include:

- (2004) U.S. Air Force Academy – Deputy IG/Chief, Complaints and Resolution. During this period he also served as an Associate Professor of Humanities and a Cadet Group Facilitator in the Academy Center for Development.
- (2006) Secretary of the Air Force IG Staff – Chief, Major Command Inspections and subsequently the Chief, Senior Officer Matters where he oversaw USAF's highly sensitive Senior Officer Unfavorable Information File.
- (2008) Andrews Air Force Base Inspector General, included oversight of Air Force One.
- (2010) Selected to Command AF ROTC Detachment 490, New Jersey Institute of Technology (also included approximately twelve colleges and university ROTC programs).

Bob received his Bachelor's Degree (1993) from the University of New Mexico where he participated in the U.S. Air Force ROTC Program. He completed his Master's Degree (2001) through California State University.
